The Story of the Candy Cane

Long ago a candy maker wanted to make a piece of candy that would remind his customers to celebrate Jesus at Christmas. He created the candy cane as his special gift to God.

*The candy maker began with **white candy** that reminds us of the **purity** of our Lord. He shaped it into a **“J”** for **“Jesus.”** When he turned it upside down, he saw it became the **staff of Our Shepherd**. The **red stripes** would remind us of the cost of our salvation that came through **Jesus’ blood**. He added the peppermint flavor to symbolize the **spices** which were the **gifts of the wise men**.*

*Today this simple candy cane still reminds us to celebrate the sweetest gift of Christmas... Jesus’ birth! **“Thanks be to God for His gift that is too wonderful to explain.”** (2 Corinthians 9:15)*
